1. Direct Service Provision

a. Respond to law enforcement requests for advocacy.

- b. Respond to hospital emergency department requests for both domestic violence and sexual assault.
- c. Provide clients with safety planning and information about civil and/or criminal justice system.
- d. Assist victims with criminal justice partner requests for assistance.
- e. Assist victims in filling out protection orders.
- f. Assist victims with referrals for legal assistance to Legal Aid, NE Coalition to End Sexual and Domestic Violence or local attorneys when applicable.
- g. Accompany victims to court proceedings.
- h. Assess the need for additional services and make appropriate referrals including shelter, legal assistance, financial assistance, and counseling.
- Contact victims by appropriate method from Incident Reports from LPD and LSO.
- j. Provide direct services, in-house, for clients who use drop-in services, assessing their needs and offering the appropriate service.
- k. Share responsibility with other staff for Staff on-call coverage.

2. Communication and Outreach

- a. Provide consultation for staff on topics that relate to the justice systems.
- b. Participate in communication and outreach with law enforcement and legal parties as needed.

3. Training/Supervision

a. Assist in providing volunteer training sessions as they relate to the justice system.

4. Stats/Administrative Documentation

a. Complete appropriate paperwork for each client.

b. Assist in agency data collection and compilation of monthly statistics.

5. Agency Citizenship

- a. Attend staff meetings, case reviews and staff development meetings.
- b. Perform other duties as assigned.
- c. Acknowledge and abide by the rules, policies and procedures of VOH.

QUALIFICATION: The ideal candidate will have a bachelor's degree in social work, counseling, criminal justice or a related field or equivalent experience. The candidate must also have experience working with survivors of relationship violence and sexual assault as well as experience working with the justice systems.
